A RESEARCH ON SANTHAL TRIBE OF WEST BENGAL

I want you all to take a glance in the Santhal tribal life of WEST BENGAL. The are many studies about the origin of this tribe. But the most approved one is that they are descendants of the Champa kingdom who came from Assam with 400 - 1000 inhabitants. Ages back, these tribes had a very violent ritual of beheading a person and offering that to the Almighty, claiming immortality. But everything got changed with time, albeit, there are many controversies about this ritual. Some of the festivals of this tribe include Sorahi, in which they deck up in their traditional wear- Kachha and Gamcha for males, and Jhajhela for females. There is a very rare festival which is not so popular in which regional wine 'Haria' is prepared by mixing boiled rice with other millets and this is offered to their God named MARANGBURU. Many often get confused with BAHA, another festival that marks the beginning of spring. But both of them are totally different. Currently the tribal of Santhal are seen to be working in high salaried jobs. Many of them would be found in the coal mines of Jamshedpur. Though some had embraced the new life style, many are still attached to their old beliefs and customs.

While surveying on this community, I felt a need for sharing a few of my opinions that can be implemented to upgrade their situation, like:

- The government should take necessary steps and initiatives for them like providing them with education scholarships.
- The government should provide them with loans so that they create a business set up.
- We should cancel their reservation completely to make them equal in every sectors and fields.
- The government should make more advertisements to connect the talent of this tribe to the world globally.



हिन्दी दिवस




हिंदी दिवस प्रत्येक वर्ष 14 सितंबर को मनाया जाता है। विशाल 1918 में महात्मा गाँधी जी ने हिंदी साहित्य सम्मेलन में हिंदी से भाषा को राष्ट्रभाषा बताने को कहा था। इसे गाांधी जी ने जनमानस की भाषा भी किया था।साल 1950 में हिंदी को सघीय भारत की आधकारक भारा का दजाष संभाला था। जिसके बाद हिन्दी भाषा का उपयोग भारत के सभी सरकारी काम-काजों में अधकारक भारा के रूप में किया जाने लगा।हिंदी दिवस को उस दिन को याद करने के लिए मनाया गया है जिसदिन हिंदी हमारे देश के आधिकारिक भाषा बन गई। ये हर साल हिंदी के महत्व पर ज़ोर देने और हर पीढी के बीच इसके बढावदेने के लिए मनाया जाता है जो अंग्रेजी से प्रभावित है। ये युवाओं को अपनी छड़ो के बारे में याद दिलाने का एक तरीका है। इससे कोई फिक्र नहीं पडता कि हम कहाँ तक पहुँचे हैं और हम क्या कहते हैं अगर हम अपनी जड़ों के साथ मैदान में डटे रहे और समन्वयित रहें तो हम अपनी पकड मजबूत बना लेंगे। आजादी मिलने के 2 साल बाद 14 सितंबर 1949 को संविधान सभा में एक मत् से हिंदी को राज्य भाषा घोषित किया गया था। इस निर्णय के बाद हिंदी के हर क्षेत्र में प्रसारित करने के लिए राष्ट्रभाषा प्रधार समिति, बर्धों के अनुरोध पर 1953 से पूरे भारत में 14 सितंबर की हर साल हिंदी दिवस के रूप में मनाया जाने लगा। भारत की संविधान सभा ने 14 सितंबर 1949 को भारत गणराज्य की आधिकारिक भाषा के रूप में हिंदी को अपनाया। हिंदी दिवस हमें ये याद दिलाने में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाता है कि हिंदी भाषा दुनिया की सबसे पुरानी भाषाओं में से एक है और प्रत्येक भारतीय को अपनी मातुँभाषा में बोलने पर गर्व महसूस करना चाहिए। हिंदी दिवस के दिन हमारे स्कूल में छात्र बेहतरीन भाषण देते हैं और इस भाषा के

जरिए लोगों को हिंदी दिवस को लेकर और जागरूक भी करते हैं। छात्राएं अपनी मातृभाषा की प्रतिं अपना प्यार और सम्मान दर्शाते हैं और लोगों को इस भाषा का ज्यादा से ज्यादा इस्तेमाल करने के लिए प्रेरित करते हैं।


